Reminder: Follow Legion social media policies

Over the past months, some inappropriate social media-related postings were made via Legion Branch sites. One contained overt swearing. This is a reminder to inform regions that their social media and websites are not their personal sites. They belong to, and are affiliated with their Branch, and therefore with the Legion as a whole. Anyone posting anything must be familiar with the Legion's social media policy and related guidelines which can be found within the member portal under marketing resources. If they are in doubt about whether something they are about to post is acceptable, they can reach out to their leadership team.

The Legion's social media policy is found within the organization's brand guidelines, and a separate document outlining what to remember when setting up social media related sites, was also released as part of member portal resources several years ago.

Fact checking reminder

In a recent interview, a local Service Officer spoke about a specific program that is managed by VAC and helps Veterans. In the interview however, the well-meaning officer shared incorrect information about the program that later had to be corrected.

A reminder to ensure facts are gathered and accurate before sharing them, and if unsure of simply let a reporter know you'll have to update later. It's always best to avoid this sort of scenario because once wrong information is shared, it's almost impossible to later reach all the people who would already have heard or read it.
